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








WATCH NIGHT SERVICE 2024 SATISFY US WITH GOOD THINGS

n May 5, 1965, in Lagos, Nigeria, a princess was born into the royal family; Kofoworola Abimbola Akitoye. Known as 'Kofo' by most, her dad is the only one who called her by her full first name.

The early years of her life she spent on the campus of the University of Lagos (Unilag) for her elementary education. Later, Princess Kofo was admitted into middle/ high school at the Federal Government College-Lagos Ijanikin, which is a boarding school where she studied for five years.

She had a decent childhood with the exception of her parents separating when she was at a young age. Princess Kofo was a daddy's girl and the relationship that she really wanted with her dad was strained throughout her high school years. Nevertheless, God Almighty continued to be with her as the foundation of her faith was built, growing up in the Catholic Church while living with her mom.

During her years at Apapa Parish she worked as an usher and joined the prayer group. While living in Nigeria, Mr. and Mrs. Odutola had two boys, Olaide and Boluwatife. Life was good! Mrs. Odutola and her family continued to live in Nigeria until such time that her husband had a revelation from God to move to the United States of America. A move which was difficult to understand because she had her family established in Nigeria and held a good job at a bank with prospective opportunities for growth. The family's decision to move was like leaving certainty in a land most comfortable, for a land of uncertainty and without familiarity. However, in obedience, she decided to leave her job and relocate to America with her husband and two children.
